The Horsemanship Finals will be open to all riders who have qualified by earning any combination of three (3) points in qualifying classes since November 1, 2008. This class is open to junior and amateur riders who have never won any PCHA, USEF, Local or National medal class, equitation, hunter or jumper class with fences 3' or higher. Riders may not compete if they have won any association medal finals where fences are 3'. Trainers and Riders MUST be members of CPHA.

1st & 2nd Rounds - The class will be held over a 2'6" course with a minimum of eight fences, no combinations, with at least two changes of direction. One test of either a halt or trot fence must be included in round one. There will be two rounds with scores announced for each round and averaged together for the final score. All riders will return for round two in the reverse order of go. There will be a work-off after the two rounds with the top four and anyone within three points of the leader or a score of 80 or above using USEF Equitation Tests 1-8. Riders will not be asked to dismount or ride without stirrups. All riders will ride for ribbons and awards 1st thru 10th and participate in a victory gallop. There will be two judges (when available) who may sit together during the work off only. In round one, there will be a specified call judge to break any ties for ribbons. There is to be no contact between exhibitor and trainer to either the judges or the course designer prior to or at the conclusion of any round without the specified technical delegate of show steward present.

The same horse must be ridden through all phases of the competition. However, due to illness or injury of the horse, a rider may petition to ride a substitute horse. This substitution must be approved by the Appeals Committee consisting of the Show Manager, the Chief Steward, and the Official Veterinarian, who has in fact examined the horse and determined it's unsuitability to continue.

The Children's-Adult Medal Finals will be open to all riders that have qualified by earning any combination of three (3) points in qualifying classes since November 1, 2008. This class is open to child and adult riders who have never won any PCHA, USEF, Local, National or Regional medal class, equitation, hunter and or jumper class with fences 3'3" or higher. Trainers and Riders MUST be members of CPHA.

CONTINUED - - -

1st & 2nd Rounds - The class will be held over a 3' course of a minimum of eight fences with at least two changes of direction. There will be two rounds with scores announced for each round and averaged together for the final score. All riders will return for the 2nd round in the reverse order of go. The top four riders from rounds one and two (including anyone tied for 4th) and anyone within three points of the leader will be asked to work off using USEF Tests 1-8. Riders will not be asked to dismount or ride without stirrups. The work off scores will not be announced. Riders will ride for ribbons and awards first thru tenth and a victory gallop. There will be two judges (when available) who may sit together during the work off only. In each round, there will be a specified call judge to break any ties for ribbons. There is to be no contact between exhibitor and trainer to either the judges or the course designer prior to or at the conclusion of any round without the specified technical delegate of show steward present.

The same horse must be ridden though all phases of the competition. However, due to illness or injury of the horse, a rider may petition to ride a substitute horse. This substitution must be approved by the Appeals Committee consisting of the Show Manager, the Chief Steward, and the Official Veterinarian, who has in fact examined the horse and determined it's unsuitability to continue.

Hunter Courses: Courses will have at least eight fences with changes of direction. Fences will simulate obstacles found in the hunt field, such as brush, post and rails, walls, in-and-outs, gates, etc. No bank or water jumps. Course diagrams will be posted one hour before the class.

Under Saddle Classes: To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. No martingales permitted. In Regular, Am/Own, and Junior classes, entries may be asked to hand gallop collectively one way of the ring, at the judge's discretion. No more than eight shall be asked to hand gallop at one time.

Horses that are entered in any hunter and/or equitation class must pay a \$35 Hunter/Equitation Fee in addition to the entry deposit fee and class fees.

Horses: All horses competing at this horse show must be registered with USHJA. To make check-in easier, please bring proof of registration when you check-in. Horse registration can be done at any time online at www.usef.org

No rating. Open to horses and ponies of all ages who are eligible Pre-Green and who have not shown in Pre-Green prior to December 1, 2002. To be judged on performance and soundness. Horses will NOT be jogged. To be shown over a course of fences 2'6" in height.

PRE-GREEN WORKING HUNTERS

Entry Fee: \$40 Per Class (\$55 for Class #28)

USEF 'C' Rated. A Pre-Green Hunter is defined as a horse that at the closing date of entries was not a 1st Year Green, 2nd Year Green, or Regular Hunter under USEF Rules. A horse may show as a Pre-Green Hunter for no more than two years once it has reached five years of age. To be judged on performance and soundness. Horses will NOT be jogged. Fences 3'. \$5 per entry will be added back in class #28. *No USEF Points for Class #25 – only PCHA, LAHJA, and Gold Coast points.*

25, 26, 27 – Over Fences **28** – \$100 Over Fences **29** – Under Saddle

MODIFIED WORKING HUNTERS

Entry Fee: \$40 Per Class (\$55 for Class #33)

No Rating. There are no cross entry restrictions. To be shown over a course of fences approximately 3'3" in height. Horses will NOT be jogged. \$5 per entry will be added back in class #33.

OPEN WORKING HUNTERS

Entry Fee: \$40 Per Class (\$55 for Class #38)

No Rating. There are no cross entry restrictions. To be shown over a course of fences approximately 3'6" in height. Horses will NOT be jogged. \$5 per entry will be added back in class #38.

GREEN WORKING HUNTERS

Entry Fee: \$40 (\$55 for Class #43)

USEF & PCHA 'B' Rated. Fence height 3'6" for 1st Year and 3'9" for 2nd Year. To be judged on performance and manners. Horses will be jogged for soundness. \$5 per entry will be added back in class #43. *No USEF Points for Class #40 – only PCHA, LAHJA, and Gold Coast points.*

REGULAR WORKING HUNTERS

Entry Fee: \$40 (\$55 for Class #48)

USEF & PCHA 'B' Rated. Fence height 3'9". To be judged on performance and manners. Horses will be jogged for soundness. \$5 per entry will be added back in class #48. *No USEF Points for Class #45 – only PCHA, LAHJA, and Gold Coast points.*

All ponies are required to possess a current USEF Measurement Card or valid measurement for issued by the USEF and it must be shown at the horse show office before numbers are released.

No rating. Open to small, medium and large ponies ridden by a child under 17 years of age. To be shown over a course of fences at regulation pony heights. To be judged on performance and soundness but ponies will not be jogged.

CHILDREN'S PONY HUNTERS

Entry Fee: \$40 Per Class

USEF 'C' Rated. Open to ponies ridden by a Junior exhibitor. HORSES OR RIDERS may not cross enter into any Junior Hunter Class. Riders may not cross enter into any division where the fences exceed 3'3" (except Children's Jumpers).

Fence height 2'3" for small/medium ponies and 2'6" for large ponies, spreads may not exceed fence height. Ponies will NOT be jogged for soundness. *No USEF Points for Class #55 – only PCHA, LAHJA, and Gold Coast points.*

PONY WORKING HUNTERS

Entry Fee: \$40 (\$55 for Classes #63 & #68)

USEF & PCHA 'B' Rated. Small Ponies - Open to ponies not exceeding 12.2 hands. Jumps 2'3". Medium Ponies - Open to ponies not exceeding 13.2 hands. Jumps 2'6". Large Ponies - Open to ponies over 13.2 hands and not exceeding 14.2 hands. Jumps 3'. \$5 per entry will be added back in classes #63 & #68. *No USEF Points for Classes #60 and #65 – only PCHA, LAHJA, and Gold Coast points.*

GREEN PONY HUNTERS

USEF 'B' Rated. A Green Pony is a pony of any age not exceeding 14.2 hands that has not been shown over fences at the regulation height or higher for its respective section (2'3" for small; 2'6" for medium; and 2'9" for large) prior to December 1st of 2006 at a Regular Competition of the Federation or Equine Canada or any national or international competition. Once a pony has broken its green status in one section, it will not regain its green status by moving into another hunter pony section.

SMALL PONY HUNTERS - Open to ponies not exceeding 12.2 hands. Fences 2'3".

MEDIUM PONY HUNTERS - Open to ponies not exceeding 13.2 hands. Fences 2'6".

LARGE PONY HUNTERS - Open to ponies over 13.2 hands and not exceeding 14.2 hands. Fences 2'9". *No USEF Points for Classes #60G and #65G – only PCHA, LAHJA, and Gold Coast points.*

No cross entry restrictions at one day shows. Fence height 3'; spreads not to exceed fence height. Horses will NOT be jogged for soundness. *No USEF Points for Classes #76 and #76Y – only PCHA, LAHJA, and Gold Coast points.*

Adult Amateur Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same show with fences exceeding 3'3" except Adult Amateur Jumpers, Junior-Amateur Modified Jumpers, Equitation and Medal Classes. No cross entry restrictions at one day shows. Fence height 3'; spreads not to exceed fence height. Horses and ponies will NOT be jogged for soundness. *No USEF Points for Classes #110 and #110Y – only PCHA, LAHJA, and Gold Coast points.*

180. CPHA HORSEMANSHIP MEDAL – 2009 Qualifying Class

Children & Adults – Fences 2'6". No Work-Off – One test, either a halt or trot fence as part of the original course. Riders & Trainers must be members of the CPHA in order to compete in this class. Three points qualifies for the finals. **Three (3) riders must complete the course. This class is open only to riders who have NOT qualified for this year's finals.**

181. CPHA CHILD/ADULT MEDAL – 2009 Qualifying Class

Children & Adults – Fences 3' At least two riders must work off, USEF tests 1-9. Riders & Trainers must be members of the CPHA in order to compete in this class. Three points qualifies for the finals. **Three (3) riders must complete the course. This class is open only to riders who have NOT qualified for this year's finals.**

182. USEF PONY EQUITATION CLASS – 2010 Qualifying Class

17 & Under – Fences applicable to the height of the pony. **Six (6) riders must complete the course.** Jumping Phase and Work Off of the top four. Must be a member of USEF.

196. WCE JUNIOR-AMATEUR MEDAL CLASS – 2009 Qualifying Class

Abuse – Competitors who abuse horses will be eliminated by the judge and may be subject to fines and/or additional penalties. Excessive abuse includes, but is not limited to, use of the whip anywhere in front of the horse's shoulder, or more than three times behind the girth.

Levels – For the purposes of clarification, each jumper division has been assigned a specific height level. Within each level, at least 60% of the jumps will be set at the maximum height specified, with a variance of + or - 2" (5cm). Modifications may be made in accordance with USEF rules.

The 2009 Gold Coast Series Horse Show '7' (#315129) is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. UNITED STATES EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-Licensed Competition and signing the entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf or myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the ByLaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian , Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the ByLaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 908.4

- a. For each horse entered, send only a \$35 Entry Deposit Fee and any fees for stalls requested - \$175 show **(\$190 if late)** or \$60/day **(\$70 if late)**.
- b. Send with your completely filled out entry blank on or before the closing date of entries. The entry form MUST include: Name of horse and a complete description, name of owner and address, name of trainer, and classes or divisions you intend to compete in (for scheduling purposes). Incomplete entries will be considered and treated as late entries and will be charged a \$35 late fee.
- c. Bring a check for the remainder of your fees to the show. No numbers will be issued without full payment. A signed open check may be left for classes that are added during the show.
- d. If entry blanks are postmarked on or before the closing date of entries and are properly filled out the Entry Deposit Fee will be credited to the entries due.
- e. **LATE ENTRIES AND/OR INCOMPLETE ENTRIES WILL FORFEIT THE ENTRY DEPOSIT FEE!!**
- f. DO NOT make entries from the time schedule. Consult the index to classes. Time schedules are subject to change after the close of entries. Therefore, upon arrival at the show, be sure to check the time schedule in the Show Office.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: Any horse on the grounds that is not showing in the horse show will pay a \$35 'Non-Showing' Fee.

SHOW SCRATCH REFUNDS:

A horse that is scratched before the closing date of entries will receive a full refund of all fees paid for that horse's account. A horse that is scratched after the closing date of entries but before the entry number is picked up will receive a full refund of any fees paid for that horse's account with the exception of the stall fee and entry deposit fee. After the show starts, with official show vet certificate only, full refunds will be given minus a \$35 per horse "scratch fee", stall fees, and fees for classes already held prior to notification, whether exhibited in or not.

SUBSTITUTIONS: A new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse. There will be a \$35 office charge.

ADD BACK MONEY: In classes with add back, prize money is computed from the number of horses that actually show. Horses that are entered but do not show up will forfeit their add back money.

PRIZES: All class winners will receive a trophy and ribbons through 6th place (8th for hunters and equitation) in addition to any prize money. Prize money will pay to 5th place; 30%, 25%, 20%, 15%, 10%. Prize money checks will be made to the owner listed on the entry and will be mailed within 30 days after the show. **NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE MAILED UNLESS THE SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OF THE OWNER IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY BLANK.** If the person receiving prize money is different than the owner, it must be noted on the entry blank.

MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold Langer Equestrian Group Inc. and the Los Angeles Equestrian Center harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted unless the entry blank is signed by a parent or guardian. The signature of instructors, agents or other unrelated persons will not be acceptable.

MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves to itself, the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or rising out of or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, change any course, cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; change rings or rotate judges; change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule.

RETURNED CHECKS: Checks returned by the bank for any reason will be handled as follows: **All returned checks will be charged an additional 10% penalty (\$25 minimum).** Accounts will be given 10 days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned into the sanctioning associations for further disciplinary action. Repeat offenders in a given show year will be turned in immediately with no 10 day grace period.

SCHOOLING RULES: Schooling will be permitted in designated areas only. The word schooling includes but is not limited to riding, driving, lunging, leading, and exercising. **In accordance with California State Law, poling and/or the use of offsets WILL NOT be permitted.** Violations of schooling regulations may be considered cause for fines and/or elimination. Hunter rings will be open the day prior to the start of the show and at management's discretion, for a limited amount of time at the beginning and at the conclusion of the show day.

SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Please be advised that starters are part of the schooling supervisor staff and as such have authority to enforce USEF schooling rules. Violations in the schooling ring should immediately be brought to the attention of the starter of the corresponding ring.

STABLING: Stalls, whether occupied by horses, feed, or tack, will be available for \$175 (Wednesday-Sunday) or \$60 per day. No bedding is provided and only shavings are permitted. Stalls are of wood construction, 10' x 10' with doors. **Horses may not arrive before Tuesday at 1:00 p.m. STALL FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED.**

TRAILER INS: There will be a \$45 per day grounds fee for horses that trailer in and do not require a stall.

FEED AND BEDDING: Hay, grain and bedding will be available at the Horse Show. Prior arrangements can be made with US Horse Feed & Shaving. The phone number is 818.559.9699.

RV PARKING: RV Parking is available at the rate of \$50 per day.

CONFLICTS: It is the intention of management to avoid holding rings to wait for horses and/or riders. Riders with conflicts must arrange their jumping order with the starters so that they will not hold up a class. Starters have the authority from management to scratch riders who are not timely.

ABUSE: Competitors who abuse horses will be eliminated by the judge and may be subject to fines and/or penalties. Excessive abuse includes, but is not limited to, use of the whip four or more times and/or use of the whip in front of the horses shoulder.

DESIGNATED PARKING: All trucks, autos, golf carts, and other motorized vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. To insure the safety of all exhibitors, only persons with a valid driver's license may operate any motorized vehicles (electric or gasoline).

MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the rules of US Equestrian Bio-Hazardous Medical Waste containers are provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

ARENAS: All warm up and competitions arenas contain sand footing. Dimensions are as follows: Equidome – 150 x 300; Large Oval – 150 x 300; East Ring – 135 x 285; Allen Arena – 150 x 300.

DOGS: All dogs on the show grounds must be leashed at all times. No dogs are allowed in stable area, in or around arenas or other areas, or in exterior RV areas without leashes. See USEF GR301.6
Dogs are a serious safety problem at Horse Shows. All exhibitors should be advised that this show is SERIOUS about loose dogs being a nuisance at events and we encourage all persons to keep their dogs leashed and under control, for their safety ... and the safety of others.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

STALL DAMAGE: Trainers will be held responsible for any damage to stalls under their purview, as listed on the official stall chart, beyond normal wear and tear. Charges for damaged stalls will range from a minimum of \$200 to a maximum of \$2,000, depending upon the severity of the damage. Damage includes holes in the canvas, cutting the canvas, writing on the canvas, altering stall doors and/or configuration, removing panels, and removing the safety anchors. Trainers are responsible for reporting existing damage prior to moving into the stalls in order to avoid charges.
