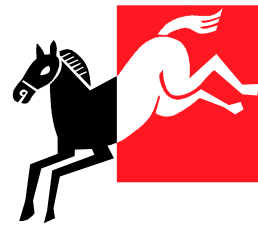

HUNTER DIVISION: Unless otherwise stated, all hunter classes are to be judged on performance and soundness. To be shown over a course of at least eight fences with one or two changes of direction. The fences will simulate obstacles found in the hunt field such as: brush, post and rails, walls, in-and outs, gates, coops, aikens, etc. There will be no bank jumps or water jumps. Course diagrams will be posted approximately one hour before the class.

Under Saddle Classes – Horses to be shown at a walk, trot can canter both directions of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. No martingales permitted. All 'A' rated USEF divisions, to maintain awards in under saddle classes, a horse must complete the course in at least one over fences class in that division. In Regular, Amateur Owner and Junior sections, entries may be asked to hand-gallop collectively one way of the ring at the judge's discretion. No more than eight shall be asked to hand-gallop at one time.

Horses entered in any hunter and/or equitation class must pay a \$75 Hunter/Equitation Fee in addition to the entry deposit fee and class fees. Hunters and Equitation Horses will be allowed to add or scratch classes the day before with no extra charge and will receive full credit for scratched classes. Adds or scratches that are done the day of the class, will incur a \$20 per class charge.

CHILDREN'S WORKING HUNTERS

Entry Fee: \$50 Per Class

USEF 'C' Rated & PCHA 'A' Rated. Open to horses and ponies ridden by a junior exhibitor. HORSES OR RIDERS may not cross enter into any Junior Hunter Class (at the same show). Riders may not cross enter into 1st Year, 2nd Year, or Regular Working Hunters at the same show. Children Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same show with fences exceeding 3'3" except Children's Jumpers, Junior-Amateur Modified Jumpers, Equitation and Medal Classes. No cross entry restrictions at one day shows. Fence height 3'; spreads not to exceed fence height. Horses will NOT be jogged for soundness.

USEF 'C' Rated & PCHA 'A' Rated. Open to horses and ponies ridden by Amateurs who are not longer eligible to compete as Junior Exhibitors. HORSES OR RIDERS may not cross enter into any Amateur Owner Hunter class (at the same show). Riders may not cross enter into 1st Year, 2nd Year, or Regular Working Hunters at the same show. Adult Amateur Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same show with fences exceeding 3'3" except Adult Amateur Jumpers, Junior-Amateur Modified Jumpers, Equitation and Medal Classes. An Adult Amateur rider may ride an Amateur Owner Hunter in the A/O Hunter Under Saddle Class. No cross entry restrictions at one day shows. Fence height 3'; spreads not to exceed fence height. Horses and ponies will NOT be jogged for soundness.

JUMPER DIVISION

In all classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. In ties not involving first place, times taken in the first round will separate those tied with equal faults unless otherwise noted.

Jumper Nominating Fee: Horses entered in any jumper class that does not offer prize money, the Children's-Adult Amateur Jumper Classic, and the 'Level Stake' classes MUST pay a \$100 Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$50 entry deposit fee. Horses entered in jumper classes that offer prize money, MUST pay a \$150 Jumper Nominating Fee in addition to the \$50 entry deposit fee. These horses must be recorded with the USEF. GRAND PRIX horses must include an additional \$100 Grand Prix Nominating Fee. Horses entered only in the Grand Prix are exempt from paying the \$150 Jumper Nominating Fee but they must send the Grand Prix Nominating Fee of \$100.

Jumper Nominating Fee Refund Policy: The refund schedule will be as follows: Before the closing date of entries - 100% - After closing date but before show - 50% After the show starts - there will be no refunds

Poling: Manual poling and/or the use of off-sets are prohibited for all horses at this show.

Jumper Tables: Refer to time schedule. Management reserves the right to change tables in all jumper classes with adequate notice to exhibitors.

Martingales and Draw Reins: In any jumper class offering prize money of \$1,000 to \$4,999 only standing martingales or running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted. In any class offering prize money of \$5,000 or more only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted. Draw reins may only be used when schooling or in classes offering less than \$1,000.

Whips: Competitors are prohibited from using a whip that is longer than 30" (75cm) while in the process of jumping or schooling over a fence. A rider may not carry more than one whip. Whips that are weighted at the end are prohibited at any time.

Attire: Management will allow competitors to compete without riding coats. If a riding coat is not worn, riders must wear a shirt with a collar or a choker, neatly tucked into riding breeches. A windbreaker or raincoat may be worn if conditions require. See specifications for special classes regarding attire.

45 Second Clock: Competitors will have 45 seconds from the time the judge sounds an audible signal to cross between the start markers in the proper direction and start on course. If the competitor does not cross through the start line within the allotted time, the time on course will start will start when the 45 seconds expires.

Orders of Go: Will be computer generated and rotated by the Starter, except for Special Classes.

Jumper Changes: Changes must be made by 5:00 pm or within 30 minutes after the last jumper class (whichever occurs first) to avoid being charged a post entry penalty. Changes made after this time may not be accepted and will be charged the post entry penalty. **Exhibitors are encouraged to enter the classes in which they plan to compete on their entry blank as adds will not be accepted for a class scheduled on that same day.**

Time Allowed: The time allowed is based on a minimum speed of 350 meters/minute (382 yards/minute). 328 meters/minute (360 yards/minute) for Pony Jumpers, or in very small or indoor arenas. The time allowed will be adjusted accordingly.

Arena Size & Footing:

Grass Field - 200' x 400' with grass footing.

Indoor Arena - 150' x 300' with sand footing.

Abuse -Competitors who abuse horses will be eliminated by the judge and may be subject to fines and/or additional penalties.

JUMPER HEIGHTS

If a specific height is used in lieu of a Level, either feet and inches or metric units may be used. However, in all cases a minimum of 50% of the obstacles in the first round must be set at the height indicated and the spreads must be set in conformance with the USEF level chart. Obstacles in the first round (with the exception of the first obstacle and those in combinations, which may be lower) may not vary by more than 2" (5cm) in height from the class height indicated in the prize list.

After the first round, in the event of equality of faults and time for first place only, there will be one jump off in which time will decide. The remaining horses will be classified according to their penalties and time in the first round.

Declarations must be made and starting fees paid by 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 17th. The order of go will be drawn shortly thereafter in the horse show office.

Management requires that all participants be formally attired. Riders must wear black, dark blue, dark green, or scarlet coats; white shirt with white stock, white choker, or white tie; white, canary, or buff breeches; and safety helmet. NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE PERMITTED.

The winner of this event will receive a special award and a lettered cooler for the horse. In addition, ribbons 1st thru 12th will be awarded. Prize Money will be divided as follows: 1st-\$7500; 2nd-\$5500; 3rd-\$3250; 4th-\$2000; 5th-\$1500; 6th-\$1250; 7th-\$1000; 8th-\$750; 9th-\$750; 10th-\$500; 11th-\$500; 12th-\$500

This is a World Cup Qualifying Event: C.S.I.-W. Los Angeles (U.S.A.), November 14, 2009. Riders will receive points thru 16th place. Competition will be held in a sand arena measuring approximately 150' x 300'. The course will be set at the 'International Standard'. Maximum fence height of 1.60M. Speed 350 meters per minutes. No standing martingales.

A rider may ride more than one horse, the horse going for World Cup points must be declared before the start of the class, and that horse must be ridden first. Number of horses per rider – 2.

To be conducted under FEI Table A, Art. 238.2.2 – Table A competition against the clock with one initial round and one jump off against the clock. Competitors with equality of penalties for first place in the initial round take part in a jump-off against the clock. The remaining competitors are classified according to their penalties and time in the initial round.

Declarations must be made and starting fees paid by 4:00 p.m. on Friday, September 19th. The order of go will be drawn shortly thereafter in the horse show office.

Management requires that all participants be formally attired. Riders must wear black, dark blue, dark green, or scarlet coats; white shirt with white stock, white choker, or white tie; white, canary, or buff breeches; and safety helmet. NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE PERMITTED.

The winner of this event will receive a special award and a lettered cooler for the horse. In addition, ribbons 1st thru 12th will be awarded. Prize Money will be divided as follows: 1st-\$15,000; 2nd-\$11,000; 3rd-\$6500; 4th-\$4000; 5th-\$3000; 6th-\$2500; 7th-\$2000; 8th-\$1500; 9th-\$1500; 10th-\$1000; 11th-\$1000; 12th-\$1000

FEI HORSE PASSPORTS - "All horses entered for the CSI must have an official Passport or a National Passport validated by the FEI as a means of identification." National Federations are responsible for the accuracy of all information entered in passports when issued.

These documents must contain all relevant information. Particular emphasis is placed on the recording of the following details: 1) Particulars of ownership; 2) Vaccination against Equine Influenza which has been mandatory since January 1, 1980; 3) Identification: correctly filled in description and diagram.

All Grand Prix held at this show are eligible for inclusion on the USEF
Computer List. Certification Number 9183.

ATTENTION GRAND PRIX COMPETITORS

Grand Prix horses must be on the grounds of the horse show for the 24 hour period prior to either or both FEI classes (\$25,000 Open Welcome Stake or \$50,000 Grand Prix). Horses must be present for Veterinary Inspection and to jog on Wednesday at 4:00 p.m. at the Allen Arena West. All passports must be turned into the horse show office before this time. Immediately following the jog, Grand Prix horses will be required to move to a secured stabling area (per FEI rules). FEI Rules for schooling will be strictly enforced. Each horse will receive five (5) credentials for access to the secured stabling area. All Grand Prix declarations must be made by 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday for Thursday's Welcome Stake and 4:00 p.m. on Friday for Saturday's Grand Prix. No declarations will be allowed after the jog. During the 24 hour period before the Grand Prix, horses will be under the control of the chief steward and his staff at all times. Horses must have their numbers visibly displayed whenever they leave their stalls and must follow all other pertinent FEI rules.

In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies is to be settled exclusively by the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland.
- It is the responsibility of NFs to ensure their participants are of the correct age.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farrier and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

In case of lameness or other medical problem, which would render an entered horse unusable in the opinion of the official show vet, a second horse may be substituted. Only one substitution will be allowed for a given rider.

The finals will be conducted in three phases as follows:

PHASE #1 - All riders who have qualified for the Finals shall compete over a course of 12 to 14 fences at 1.40M (4'7") in height and 4' to 5' in width. This phase will be scored under Table III – Faults Converted Into Seconds with the competitor with the shortest time declared the winner. This phase will be held in conjunction with Junior/Amateur Owner Jumper Class #265 & #270.

PHASE #2 - All riders shall compete over a course of 12 to 14 fences at 1.40M (4'7") in height and 4' to 5' in width. This phase will be held on conjunction with Junior/Amateur Owner Jumper Classes #266 & #271. This phase will be scored under Table II, Section 2a - Time First Jump Off.

For both Phases #1 and #2, points are given to all Finals Competitors having finished the initial round. The winner receives one point more than the number of Championship starters in each competition; 2nd Place receives two points less than the winner; 3rd Place receives three points less than the winner, etc. Competitors who were eliminated or retired in the initial round do not receive points. Points won by competitors who are tied are added up and divided equally. Fractions of .5 and more are rounded up; fractions of less than .5 are rounded down. After phase #2 is completed, points are transferred into penalties. The competitor with the highest number of points after two competitions will have 0 (zero) penalties. For all other competitors, the number of penalties will be calculated by multiplying with the coefficient of .5 the difference between their number of points and the points of the leading competitor after two phases.

CONTINUED - - -

PHASE #3 - To be held in conjunction with The \$5,000 Junior-Amateur Owner Jumper Classic. The 20 riders with the best scores after phase #2 will compete in the first round of the Junior-Amateur Owner Jumper Classic. One round over a grand prix type course, fence height of 1.40M (Level 7). Jumping and time penalties will be added to the rider's scores from Phases #1 and #2, with the overall winner to be the competitor with the lowest number of faults after the three competitions. No jump-off will be needed unless competitors are tied for first place after all three phases, in which case, the jump-off will be the Jump-Off of the Classic. Other ties will be broken by fastest time. The order for Phase #1 will be drawn. The order for Phase #2 shall be reversed by the order of finish from Phase #1, the rider with the slowest time to go first and so on down the line. The 20 riders (and ties) for Phase #3 will go in reverse order of standing in both rounds. AWARDS - Prize money of \$5,000 will be divided as follows: 1st - \$2,500, 2nd - \$1,500, 3rd - \$1,000. PCHA Coolers to 3rd, ribbons to 10th and any other awards as the PCHA or show may bestow, including a Finals' High Point Qualifier Award.

The Onondarka Medal Finals will consist of two qualifying rounds judged by at least 2 judges using the numerical scoring system. All riders will compete in Rounds 1 and 2. There will be a final round of the top 15 and a work off of the top 8 plus any rider within 3 percentage points of the leader.

The scores from the first 2 rounds will be averaged and carried into Round 3. Scores from Round 3 will be averaged and then the average will be combined with the average brought into Round 3 to produce an overall average. The judges will sit together for the work off and their score will be added to the overall average. The top 8 riders plus any rider within 3 percentage points of the leader will work off (USEF Tests 1-18). If riders are tied after the work off, the judges will confer to place those tied. There will be no further work offs.

The order of go for Round 1 will be drawn. Round 2 will be the reverse of Round 1. Round 3 will ride low score to high score from the first two rounds. Only the top 15 scores and ties for 15th place will return for Round 3. The order of go for the Work Off will be lowest to highest average scores.

A protest, if lodged, must be filed within 1 hour of the conclusion of the class. No money need be given with the protest, but it must be written, signed, and handed to a member of the appeals committee.

The same horse must be ridden through all phases of the competition. However, due to illness or injury of the horse, a rider may petition to ride a substitute horse, but this must be approved by the Appeals Committee consisting of the Manager, the Chief Steward, and the official Horse Show Veterinarian. Except for what is specified above, USEF Rules regarding equitation classes will be followed.

Rounds 1 & 2 will receive a trophy and ribbons through 8th place. The winning rider will receive a special award and a cooler. The winning trainer will also receive a special award. In addition, coolers will be awarded to the top 8. Ribbons through 8th.

Eligibility: Open to riders who have accrued at least ten points in WCE Junior-Amateur qualifying Medal Classes since the preceding Final. Exception: previous Final winners are ineligible. Riders who show at the Final's show in a non-restricted jumper class with fence heights above level 7 (1.40M) may NOT enter this class. All riders will compete in rounds one and two. There will be a third round consisting of the top 15. The Warm Up Class is open only to WCE Horse/Rider combinations. The Warm Up Class will be judged as a jumper class, Table II, Section 1.

Judging: The final will be judged under the current rules and standards of the USEF equitation jumper oriented medal classes. Although this class is judged on the rider's equitation style, the manner in which the horse and the course is ridden should reflect the qualities necessary for an efficient (time saving) pace and track with the horse in a frame to minimize knockdowns. During each round, one point (1) will be subtracted from the rider's score for each commenced second taken over the time allowed and a minimum of four (4) points will be deducted for each knockdown on course. The maximum permissible score for a round with one or more time faults and knockdowns is 90. A jumper type horse with jumper equipment is allowed and will not be penalized. Stallions are allowed per USEF jumper division rules. Judges will sit together for rounds 1 through 3, and will give one score after each competitor's ride. They will use the open numerical scoring system, and the scores **will be** announced. Judges are **required** to walk all courses and where there are striding options the judges are asked not to penalize any option that might be used to achieve the best result appropriate to any individual horse/rider combination.

Scoring:

- Round 1 will be judged under a modified power and speed format. (Table II, Sec 2c), with no time allowed for the power phase, and a 400 meters/minute time allowed for the speed phase. Horses will go on to the speed phase regardless of knockdowns.
- Round 2 will be judged over a jumper type course that will include at least one double and one triple combination (or three doubles), as well as a liverpool, and a time allowed based on a time of 375m/m.
- Round 3, which will immediately follow round two, will be judged over a speed or jump-off type course with a time allowed based on a speed of 400m/m. The scores from Rounds 1 and 2 will be averaged and carried into Round 3. Only the top 15 and anyone tied for 15th position will come back for Round 3. The score from Round 3 will be added to the average brought in (from Rounds 1 and 2) to produce an overall score. There will be no further rounds or work offs after round 3.

Ties: Ties for any placing after any round will be broken based upon the most efficient time in that round, with the higher placing given to the faster time. **Courses:** Courses throughout the final will consist of advanced equitation/jumper type fences approximately 3'6" in height with spreads from 3'6" to 4'3". A plank may not be the top element of any obstacle. *Time allowed is a definite factor in this class and may only be changed by the course designer after the round of one of the first three competitors and only if he/she thinks a gross error was made in the original calculation.*

Start Order: The start order for Round 1 will be drawn. Start order for Round 2 will be reverse order from Round 1. The start order for Round 3 will be low score to high score from the first two rounds. Riders must walk the course for Rounds 2 and 3 prior to Round 2.

Schooling Rules: USEF Jumper schooling rules will be followed for all phases of this final. **Awards:** After Rounds 1 and 2 riders will receive ribbons thru 6th place for both the Juniors and Amateurs. After Round 3 the top 10 will receive awards, ribbons and coolers. Special awards will go to the highest placing three riders of opposition, if available, within the top 15. The trainers of the overall champion and the highest placed opposition will receive a special award.

Substitutions: The same horse must be ridden through all phases of the competition. However, due to illness or injury of the horse a rider may petition to ride a substitute horse. This substitution must be approved by the Appeals Committee consisting of the Show Manager, the Chief Steward and the Official Veterinarian, who has in fact examined the horse and determined it's unsuitability to continue. **Special Condition:** If a competitor or trainer wishes to discuss any part of the WCE Finals with one of the judges or the course designer, one of the following must be present: the technical delegate, a show steward, or a designated representative of show management.

Protests: A protest must be made in writing and handed to the technical delegate, show steward, or show manager within one half hour of the class or situation being protested. A committee will be immediately convened to rule on the protest consisting of the technical delegate, a show steward, and a representative of show management. This committee will be the sole arbiter of the protest and their decision will be final without further recourse of any kind.

Riders Meeting: There will be a riders and trainers meeting prior to the warm up class with the medal finals officials. Time will be posted in the horse show office.

EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS

Open to riders who have won a first or second place ribbon at a PCHA Rated show in any open equitation class, who have won a medal class during the 2009 show season, or who have ever won a medal final.

The Equitation Championships will consist of two qualifying rounds judged by at least 2 judges using the numerical scoring system. Fences 3'3" in height. All riders will compete in Rounds 1 and 2. There will be a Work Off Round of the top 4 plus any rider within 3 percentage points of the leader. The scores from the first 2 rounds will be averaged to determine the work off round. The judges will sit together for the work off and their score will be added to the overall average. The top 4 riders plus any rider within 3 percentage points of the leader will work off. If riders are tied after the work off, the judges will confer to place those tied. There will be no further work offs.

The order of go for Round 1 will be drawn. Round 2 will be the reverse order from Round 1. The Work Off Round will ride low score to high score from the first two rounds. Ribbons 1st thru 8th will be awarded in Rounds 1 & 2. All riders will compete in Round 1 and 2 and will be given a numerical score which will be averaged.

The same horse must be ridden through all phases of the competition. However, due to illness or injury of the horse, a rider may petition to ride a substitute horse, but this must be approved by the Appeals Committee, consisting of the Manager, the Chief Steward, and the official Horse Show Veterinarian. Except for what is specified above, USEF rules regarding equitation classes will be followed.

The winner of this event will receive a special award and a lettered jacket. In addition, jackets will be awarded to 2nd and 3rd place. Ribbons thru 8th.

PCHA & USEF Rated. A Pre-Green Hunter is a horse that is not a 1st Year Green, 2nd Year Green, or Regular Hunter under USEF Rules. A horse may show as a Pre-Green Hunter for no more than two years once it has reached five years of age. To be judged on performance and soundness. Horses will not be jogged. Fences 3'.

Open only to the top 20 horses from the Pre-Green Division. Horses who have won a previous Pre-Green Championship are not eligible. The top 20 horses will be determined by a point system that will be applied to the top 8 places on the judge's cards in each section of the Pre-Green classes over fences. Points will be awarded 1st - 8th place in each over fences class: 15, 12, 10, 9, 7, 5, 4, 3. Declarations and an entry fee of \$250 paid for those finishing in the top 20 by 4:00 Thursday evening or the next horses will become eligible for the Championship. Horses must be serviceably sound and may be checked by the show vet prior to the final round.

The order of go will be low to high from the point standings. Horses will be scored numerically. Each score plus the average will be announced after each ride. After the first round is completed, the horses with the top 10 averages will be asked to jump a second round over an altered course. Scores for both rounds will be averaged. The winner is the horse with the highest average. The judges will sit apart for the first round and together for the second round.

In case of a tie for place, the ordinal place on the judge's cards will determine the winner. Ties for other than first place will remain tied and money will be divided.

Riders will be required to wear black, dark blue, dark green, or scarlet coats; white shirt with white stock, white choker, or tie; white, canary, or buff breeches; and hunting cap.

The winner will receive a special award and a lettered cooler. In addition, coolers will be awarded to 2nd and 3rd place.

Ribbons will be given 1st thru 8th place. Prize money of \$5,000 will be divided as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, and 5%.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

The 2009 National Preview (#3980) and the 2009 Los Angeles National Horse Show (#2696) are covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Life, senior active, and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining, and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions, and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule; 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk/trot and academy classes (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity Classes; 9) Citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) Assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. Also exempted from this requirement are citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering any USEF recognized Competition and signing the entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the ByLaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the ByLaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 908.4

ENTRY PROCEDURES:

- a. For each horse entered, send only a \$50 Entry Deposit Fee, the appropriate Jumper Nominating Fee or Hunter Equitation Fee, plus a fee of \$225 for each stall requested. Stall requests received after the closing date of entries will be \$275.
- b. Send with your completely filled out entry blank on or before the closing date of entries. The entry form MUST include: Name of horse and complete description, all classes or divisions entered, plus all mandatory signatures. Incomplete entries, if accepted, will be considered and treated as late entries.
- c. Bring a check for the remainder of your fees to the show. No numbers will be issued without full payment. A signed open check may be left for classes that are added during the show.
- d. If entry blanks are postmarked on or before the closing date of entries and are properly filled out the Entry Deposit Fee will be credited to the entries due.
- e. LATE ENTRIES AND/OR IMPROPER ENTRIES WILL FORFEIT THE ENTRY DEPOSIT FEE!
- f. DO NOT make entries from the time schedule. Consult the index to classes. Time schedules are subject to change after the close of entries. Therefore, upon arrival at the show, be sure to check the time schedule in the Show Office.
- g. All horses entered in any hunter and/or equitation classes MUST pay a \$75 Hunter Fee. All horses entered in any jumper class without prize money must pay a \$100 Jumper Nominating Fee. All horses entered in any jumper class with prize money (except the Children's, Adult Amateur Classics) must pay a \$150 Jumper Nominating Fee.

MEMBERSHIP: Proof of USEF/USHJA and PCHA membership must be presented to the horse show office before numbers will be released. If such proof is not shown and the show is unable to verify such membership, exhibitors will be charged a \$30 USEF, a \$30 USHJA, and/or a \$10 PCHA non-member Fee. All horses competing at these horse shows must be registered with the USHJA. In order to eligible for HOTY awards and/or Zone awards horses must be recorded with USEF annually or for life.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: Any horse on the grounds that is not showing in the horse show will pay a \$50 'Non-Showing' Fee. If a horse is not declared as a non-showing horse and is found on the grounds, the fee will be \$75.

ENTRIES CLOSE: National Preview – Monday, 10/05/09 L.A. National – Monday, 10/12/09

Entries will be date stamped and treated on a first come, first served basis regardless of the closing date of entries. Stalls are limited and entries may be limited in any given class or section so please enter all classes that you think you might go in. Scratches can be made at no charge the day before the show (and the day before the class). Faxed entries and entries without payment will not be accepted.

ADDS & SCRATCHES: Horses will be allowed to add classes at no extra charge and will receive full credit for scratched classes, providing they are scratched the day before the class. For changes done the day of the class (adds if they are allowed and scratches), there will be a fee of \$20 per class and \$35 for special classes. Horses and/or riders who go in a class without entering will be charged a \$25 post entry fee.

SHOW SCRATCH REFUNDS: Horses that are scratched before the closing date of entries will receive a full refund of all fees paid for that horse's account. Horses that are scratched after the closing date of entries but before the entry number is picked up will receive a full refund of any fees paid for that horse's account with the exception of the stall fee, entry deposit fee, and 50% of the jumping nominating fee. After the show starts, with official show vets certificate only, full refunds will be given minus a \$50 per horse "scratch fee", stall fees, and fees for classes already held prior to notification, whether exhibited in or not. If a division entry fee has to be pro-rated for a vet slip refund, the individual classes entered will be surcharged \$10 for each class in which the horse competed, in addition to the \$50 "scratch fee".

SUBSTITUTIONS: With a vet's certificate, a new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse. There will be a \$50 office charge.

ADD BACK MONEY: In classes with add back, prize money is computed from the number of horses that actually show. Horses entered but not showing up will forfeit their add back money.

PRIZES: All class winners will receive a trophy and ribbons through 8th place in addition to any prize money. Prize money will pay to 5th place; 30%, 25%, 20%, 15%, 10%. Excepting Special Classes - see specifications. Prize money checks will be made to the owner listed on the entry and will be mailed within 30 days after the show. **NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE MAILED UNLESS THE SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OF THE OWNER IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY BLANK.**

MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold Langer Equestrian Group Inc. and the Los Angeles Equestrian Center harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted unless the entry blank is signed by a parent or guardian.

MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or rising out of or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, change any course, cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; change rings or rotate judges; change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule. Once divisions and/or classes have been combined, they will not be uncombined unless, on the morning of the first class, there are 8 entries in each division and/or class.

CONDITION OF ENTRY: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of Horse Show Management but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its Directors and Employees, Langer Equestrian Group Inc, the Los Angeles Equestrian Center harmless for any loss or accident to his/her horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

STABLING: Stalls, whether occupied by horses, feed, or tack, will be available for \$225 each. *Stalls received after the closing date of entries will be \$275 each.* First bedding will NOT be included. Permanent stalls are 10' x 10' wood construction with doors. Portable stalls are 9'6" x 9'6" canvas with doors. **Questions with regard to stall charges and/or changes will NOT be considered after noon on Friday of each show week.**

TRAILER INS: There will be a \$50 per day grounds fee for horses trailering in and not requiring stalls.

FEED AND BEDDING: Hay, grain and bedding will be available at the Horse Show. Prior arrangements can be made with US Horse Feed & Shavings. The phone number is 818.559.9699 and there is an order form in the prize list.

RV PARKING: RV Hookups will be available at a rate of \$350 for the duration of the show. This includes pump-out service on Thursday and Sunday. All RV's must be self-contained. **RV Parking is limited to 35 spaces. You MUST reserve an RV space on your entry blank.**

RETURNED CHECKS: Checks returned by the bank for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure. All returned checks will be charged an additional 10% penalty (minimum \$25). Accounts will be given ten days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned into USEF and Pacific Coast Horse Shows Assn. for further disciplinary action.

CLOSED RINGS: Horses are not permitted in arenas when a course is set or in the process of being set for an upcoming class.

SCHOOLING RULES: Schooling will be permitted in designated areas only. The word schooling includes but is not limited to riding, driving, lunging, leading, and exercising. **In accordance with California State Law, poling and/or the use of offsets WILL NOT be permitted.** Violations of schooling regulations may be considered cause for fines and/or elimination. Hunter rings will be open the day prior to the start of the show and for a limited amount of time at the beginning and at the conclusion of the show day.

SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Please be advised that starters have authority, as agents of management, to scratch riders who do not follow USEF schooling rules.

COURSES: Courses may consist of any combination of the following; Brush, Gate, Oxers, Post and Rails, Water, Liverpools, Ditch, Walls, Panels, Banks and Coops. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to adjust fence heights or spreads in Jumper classes as competition warrants.

CONFLICTS: It is the intention of management to avoid holding rings to wait for horses and/or riders. Riders with conflicts must arrange their jumping order with the starters so that they will not hold up a class. Starters have the authority from management to scratch riders who are not timely.

DOGS: No dogs are allowed outside of the stable area at anytime, **WHETHER LEASHED OR NOT.** Dogs are a serious safety problem at Horse Shows. All exhibitors should be advised that this facility is **SERIOUS** about dogs being a nuisance at events and we encourage everyone to leave their dogs at home.

OFF LIMIT AREAS: LAEC training rings, polo rings, and other facilities used for the normal operations of the Los Angeles Equestrian Center are not part of the showgrounds. Exhibitors and trainers are cautioned that these facilities are off limits to show competitors and their horses without the express permission of and under the immediate supervision of an LAEC authorized trainer. You may be eliminated from the show, fined, and/or asked to leave the showgrounds for violating this rule.

ABUSE: Competitors who abuse horses will be eliminated by the judge and may be subject to fines and/or penalties. Excessive abuse includes, but is not limited to, use of the whip four or more times and/or use of the whip in front of the horses shoulder.

DESIGNATED PARKING: All trucks, autos, golf carts, and other motorized vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. To insure the safety of all exhibitors, only persons with a valid driver's license may operate any motorized vehicles (electric or gasoline).

MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, and the rules of US Equestrian, Bio Hazardous Medical Waste containers are provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

ARENAS: All warm up and competitions arenas contain sand footing. Dimensions are as follows: Equidome – 150 x 300; Large Oval – 150 x 300; East Ring – 135 x 285; Allen Arena – 150 x 300. Grass Field – 200 x 400 (with sand warm up area).

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, it is compulsory for riders in all Hunter, Jumper, and Hunter Seat Equitation classes, and Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Additionally, the above headgear requirements are mandatory for juniors and strongly encouraged for adults while riding at anytime, anywhere on the competition grounds. Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) and/or protective safety vest, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge. The Federation recommends that the vest meet or surpass the current ASTM standard or be certified by the SEI. See USEF GR801.4.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Stall Damage

Trainers will be held responsible for any damage to stalls under their purview, as listed on the official stall chart, beyond normal wear and tear. Charges for damaged stalls will range from a minimum of \$200 to a maximum of \$2,000, depending upon the severity of the damage. Damage includes holes in the canvas, cutting the canvas, writing on the canvas, altering stall doors and/or configuration, removing panels, and removing the safety anchors. Trainers are responsible for reporting existing damage prior to moving into the stalls in order to avoid penalties.
