Competitors Please Note:

This index is a summary of the classes, sections, and divisions offered at the Langer Equestrian Group shows covered in this Prize List and does not contain the complete rules and specifications of the show offerings or the horse show organization rules. More complete specifications are on the LEG website at www.langershows.com, and in the rule-books and websites of the shows' approving organizations. *It is the responsibility of each entrant in a medal class to understand and comply with each association's specifications and eligibility.*

OTHER CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION

HUNTER CHAMPIONSHIPS: In Hunter championships, the titles shall be awarded to two of the four horses which have acquired the most points over fences. In addition to these points, only these four horses shall receive full points for ribbons won in Under Saddle classes and half points for ribbons won in Model classes. Ties in Hunter Championships shall be broken as specified in the USEF Rule Book. All others will remain tied and flip a coin for the awards. Points Calculated: 10, 6, 4, 2, 1, 1/2.

EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS: In equitation championships, all classes shall count equally and points shall be calculated 10, 6, 4, 2, 1, 1/2. In case of a tie for champion or reserve, the winner shall be the entry with the most points over fences. If still tied, then the winner will be the entry with the most points on the flat.

COMBINED SECTION CHAMPIONSHIPS: For all sections in which there are hunter, equitation and/or pleasure classes contained, all classes shall count equally for points and the champion will be entry with the highest overall point total. In case of a tie for champion or reserve, the winner shall be: 1) the entry with the most points over fences; if still tied: 2) the entry with the most points in the equitation flat class. Points calculated: 10, 6, 4, 2, 1, 1/2.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

The 2010 Verdugo Hills Horse Shows are covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Life, Senior Active and Junior Active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above, and Combined Driving competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 non-member registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; and 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk-trot and academy classes (classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, Pas De Deux and Quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA Beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse breeding classes.

UNITED STATES EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See 908.4

ENTRY PROCEDURES:

- For each horse entered, send only a \$25 Entry Deposit Fee, plus \$100 for each stall requested.
- Please make checks payable to: **Verdugo Hills Horse Shows**
- Deposit check **MUST** accompany each entry to receive **Early Entry Free Class**. The deposit check will be deposited prior to the show. Signed open checks, will be filled out and deposited immediately.
- In order to be eligible for the Early Entry Free Class, *FAXED ENTRIES* will not be acceptable.
- The entry form **MUST** include the following: 1) Name and number of horse and a complete description, 2) Name of owner and trainer with complete information for each, 3) Classes entered by number 4) Proper signatures 5) Proper Deposit Amounts.
- A *signed open check* must be lodged with the Show Secretary before numbers are issued. This check will cover any costs associated with adding or scratching classes during the show.
- **DO NOT** make entries from the time schedule. Consult the index to classes.
- Time schedules are subject to change after the close of entries. Therefore, upon arrival at the show, be sure to check the time schedule in the Show Office.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: Any horse stabled in the show stalls that is not showing in the horse show will pay a \$25 'Non-Showing' Fee.

SHOW SCRATCH REFUNDS:

- Horses that are scratched before the closing dates of entries will receive a full refund of all fees paid for that horse's account.
- After the closing date of entries, but before the entry number is picked up, full refund of fees paid for that horse's account except any stall fee and entry deposit fee.
- After the show starts, any balance remaining will be refunded minus a \$25 per horse "scratch fee," plus any stall fees and fees for classes already held prior to notification, whether exhibited in or not. No show scratch refund request will be considered after the end of the show.

RODE NOT ENTERED: Horses and/or riders who go in a class without entering will be charged a \$25 RNE fee.

POST ENTRIES: Horses/ riders will not be permitted to add into a class that has already begun.

PRIZES: All class winners will receive a trophy and ribbons through 6th place (8th for hunters) in addition to any prize money. Prize money will pay to 6th place; 30%, 20%, 15%, 13%, 12%, 10%. Except Special Classes - see specifications. Prize money checks will be made to the owner listed on the entry form and will be mailed within 30 days after the show. If the person receiving prize money is different than the owner, it must be noted on the entry form. **NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE MAILED UNLESS THE SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OF THE OWNER IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY BLANK.** Each show will be financially closed out 90 days following the last day of the show and outstanding checks will be void after that time. Checks will not be reissued once they have been printed and delivered.

STABLING: Stalls, whether occupied by horses, feed, or tack, will be available for \$100. Day stalls will be available for \$55 per day or any part thereof. No bedding is provided and only shavings are permitted. Stalls are of wood or canvas construction, approximately 10' x 10' with doors. **STALL FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED.**

RV PARKING: Self contained RV Parking is available at the rate of \$150 per show. A limited amount of RV's may hook up to water and/or electricity, if available.

MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold Langer Equestrian Group Inc. and the Hansen Dam Equestrian Center harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted unless the entry blank is signed by a parent or guardian. The signature of instructors, agents or other unrelated persons will not be acceptable.

MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions with regard to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, alter any course, cancel, combine, or reschedule classes, change rings, substitute judges, change specifications in jumper classes, etc. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by Management whose decision will be final.

RETURNED CHECKS: Checks returned by the bank for any reason will be handled as follows: **All returned checks will be charged an additional 10% penalty (\$25 minimum).** Accounts will be given 7 days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned into the sanctioning associations for further disciplinary action. Repeat offenders in a given show year will be turned in immediately with no 5 day grace period.

SCHOOLING RULES: Schooling will be permitted in designated areas only. The word schooling includes but is not limited to riding, driving, lunging, leading, and exercising. **In accordance with California State Law, poling and/or the use of offsets WILL NOT be permitted.** Violations of schooling regulations may be considered cause for fines and/or elimination. Hunter rings will be open the day prior to the start of the show and at management's discretion, for a limited amount of time at the beginning and at the conclusion of the show day.

SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Please be advised that starters are part of the schooling supervisor staff and as such have authority to enforce USEF schooling rules. Violations in the schooling ring should immediately be brought to the attention of the starter of the corresponding ring.

CLOSED RINGS: Horses are not permitted in arena when a course is set or in the process of being set for an upcoming class.

DESIGNATED PARKING: All trucks, autos, golf carts, and other motorized vehicles must be parked in designated areas only.

CONFLICTS: It is the intention of management to avoid holding rings to wait for horses and/or riders. Riders with conflicts must arrange their jumping order with the starters so that they will not hold up a class. Starters have the authority from management to scratch riders who are not timely.

PONY & JUNIOR HUNTER MEASUREMENT

All Ponies & Jr. Hunters are required to possess a current USEF Measurement Card or valid measurement form issued by the USEF and it must be shown at the horse show office before numbers are released. The Veterinarian on call will be physically on the grounds to measure Horses and Ponies between 9am and 11am on Sunday. Horses and Ponies will only be measured during this time, so schedule your measurement accordingly.

FEED AND BEDDING: Hay, grain and bedding will be available at the Horse Show. Prior arrangements can be made by either sending in a Feed & Bedding Form or by calling 818-563-3250 Ext 8.

SAFETY:

Motorized Vehicles and Golf Carts: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: It is compulsory for riders in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear that meets or exceeds ASTM standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. See USEF GR 801.

DOGS: Although dogs are welcome at the Hansen Dam Equestrian Center, they must be on leashes and confined mainly to the stable area. Loose dogs are a hazard at a horse show and their owners, if identified, will be subject to a fine of \$100 and the issuance of a USEF Official Warning Card. Further, for additional offenses, the owner may be disqualified from showing and removed from the show grounds. Management reserves the right to call Animal Control to have an animal removed from the premises.

COURSES: Courses may consist of any combination of the following; Brush, Gate, Oxers, Post and Rails, Water, Liverpools, Ditch, Walls, Panels, Banks and Coops. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to adjust fence heights or spreads in Jumper classes as competition warrants.

MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the rules of USEF, Bio-Hazardous Medical Waste containers are provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

ARENAS: All warm up and competitions arenas contain sand footing. Dimensions are : Ring 1: 150 x 250; Ring 2: 140 x 240

ABUSE: Competitors who abuse horses will be eliminated by the judge and may be subject to fines and/or additional penalties. Excessive abuse includes, but is not limited to, use of the whip anywhere in front of the horse's shoulder, or more than three times behind the girth.

JUMPER DIVISION

Ties: In all classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. In ties not involving first place, time taken in the first round will separate those tied with equal faults.

Minimum Entries: Classes with less than three (3) entries may be combined, cancelled, or run with or without prize money (if any), at the sole discretion of management.

Attire: Management may allow competitors to compete without riding coats. If a riding coat is not worn, riders must wear a shirt with a collar or a choker, neatly tucked into riding breeches. A windbreaker or raincoat may be worn if conditions require.
