Each class in every division/section for which there are Zone VIII or National Horse of the Year awards will receive special points in this Championship Show.

Special points will be given in all classes of USEF recognized divisions to count towards the Horse of the Year awards program. Special points are as follows: 1.5 times the points normally awarded for Champion (1<sup>st</sup>), Reserve (2<sup>nd</sup>), and third through sixth place in each respective class. Also, 1.5 times the normal points will be given for Classics.

# INDEX TO CLASSES

## HUNTER DIVISION

**Hunter Courses:** Unless otherwise stated, all hunter classes are to be judged on performance, manners, way of going and soundness. Manners and suitability to be emphasized in Children's and Adult Amateur classes. In handy classes obstacles will simulate those found in trappy hunting country, horses may be required to trot over an obstacle toward the end of the course and may be asked to lead over one obstacle.

**Hunter/Equitation Schooling:** open to all horses as an opportunity to school over the hunter/equitation jumps in the show rings during specified times on the day before the horse show starts and, if time permits, at the end of each show day at management's discretion. Attire may be informal, boots and breeches or chaps with a shoe or paddock boot with a distinct heel (no tennis shoes). Protective headgear is mandatory.

**Orders of Go:** - Classes in the hunter rings will have specific start and finish times for each class, and these times will be adhered to, posted orders may be imposed at any time. Horses who have not shown by that time will not be allowed to show. All entries must be made by 5:00pm.

## HUNTER BREEDING DIVISION

**Entry Fee - \$30 Per Class**

Open to horses only. In all hunter breeding classes, horses to be judged on conformation, quality, soundness, substance, and suitability to become a show hunter. Horses are to jog and be judged on way of going. Horses to be moved on the line. The Best Young Horse is open only to first and second place finishers from the other Hunter Breeding Classes offered. Special awards will be presented to the Champion and Reserve Champion Best Young Horse.

## **\$2,500 USHJA NATIONAL HUNTER CLASSIC**

**Entry Fee \$150**

**Special awards will be given to the highest placed Amateur and the highest placed Professional in the overall placing.**

To qualify for this classic, a horse must have been shown in at least two other classes in the working hunter sections at this show. To be shown over a course of fences approximately 3' in height with options set at 3'3" to 3'6". Distances will not be adjusted for ponies.

The top 12 horses from the first round will return for the second round. They will return in reverse order of score from the first round; lowest score going first and highest score going last.

Please see complete course specs on the USHJA website – USHJA.org.

The classic will be judged by two judges sitting together. The score from round one will be averaged with the score from round two to obtain the overall score for each horse. In case of ties in the overall placing, the score from the handy round will be used to break the ties.

Horses will not be required to jog.

Special award and ribbon to first and ribbons to 10<sup>th</sup> will be awarded.

Prize money will be divided: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%.

## JUMPER DIVISION

In all jumper classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. For other ties, time in the first round will decide between tied horses.

### Jumper Nominating Fee:

Horses entered in any jumper class set at 1.30M or above MUST pay a \$100 Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$50 Entry Deposit Fee.

### Jumper Nominating Fee Refund Policy:

Jumper Nominating Fee refund schedule will be as follows: Before the Closing Date of Entries – 100%; After The Closing Date but before Start of Show – 50%. After the show starts there will be no refunds.

### Poling:

Poling and the use of Offsets **ARE NOT** permitted at any time, anywhere on the show ground.

### Martingales and Draw Reins:

In any jumper class offering prize money of \$1,000 to \$4,999, only standing martingales or running martingales used in the conventional manner, are permitted. In any class offering prize money of \$5,000 or more, and all classes restricted to young horses, only running martingales, used in the conventional manner, are permitted. Draw reins may only be used when schooling or in classes offering less than \$1,000.

### Whips:

Competitors are prohibited from using a whip that is longer than 30" (75cm) while in the process of jumping or schooling over fences. A rider may not carry more than one whip. Whips that are weighted at the end are prohibited at any time.

### Attire:

Management may allow competitors to compete without riding coats. If a riding coat is not worn, riders must wear a shirt with a collar or a choker, neatly tucked into riding breeches. A windbreaker or raincoat may be worn if conditions require.

### Jumper Changes:

Jumper changes must be made by 5:00pm or 1/2 hour after the last jumper class (whichever occurs first). Changes made after this time will be considered post entries and may be required to work first in the order of go. ***Exhibitors are encouraged to enter the classes in which they wish to compete on their entry blank, as adds may not be accepted for a class scheduled on that same day.***

### Order of Go:

Orders for the main Jumper ring will be drawn and rotated except Special Classes. Classes in the Jumper rings will have specific starting times for each class and these times will be strictly adhered to. Orders and start times will be posted by 7:00pm each night on [www.langershows.com](http://www.langershows.com).

### Footing:

All rings are sand with decomposed granite base. For ring dimensions see page 23.

**Time Allowed:** The speed at which time allowed will be calculated will be 360 yards per minute for Pony Jumpers, and 382 yards per minute (350 meters per minute) for all other rated jumpers.

# RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

The 2010 High Prairie Fall Horse Shows are covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and will be conducted and judge

Life, Senior Active and Junior Active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above, and Combined Driving competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20. non-member registration fee and a \$5. breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: 1) Leadline; 2) Exhibitions; 3) Games and Races; and 4) Classes for 4-H Members; 5) Walk-Trot and Academy Classes (classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF Introductory Level Tests, Pas De Deux and Quadrille classes 7) NRHA endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) USEA Beginner Novice Divisions; 9) Assistant Handlers in Dressage Sport Horse breeding classes. Also exempted from this requirement are residents of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their National Federation.

## **UNITED STATES EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT**

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable-casts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

### **1. STABLING:**

*Exhibitors and Trainers please note:* Questions with regard to stall charges will not be considered after noon Friday of each show week.

a) Stalls, whether occupied by horses, feed, or tack, will be available for \$200 each week. First bedding will NOT be included. Portable stalls are 9'6" x 9'6" canvas with doors. Stalls received after the closing date of entries will be \$225 each. Stall fees are not refundable under any circumstance.

### **2. PADDOCKS:**

Turnout paddocks are on a first-reserved basis and must be paid for in advance on your entry blank. Monday morning to Sunday evening, for \$200 per week. Paddocks are steel pipe, dimensions approximately 24' x 24'. Lock and chain are not provided for paddocks. Horses found in paddocks which have not been reserved and paid for will be identified and the weekly paddock charge will be added to the owners account.

### **3. WASHRACKS:**

Plenty of wash-racks are located west of the stalls and tents, adjacent to manure disposal area. HORSES MAY NOT BE TIED TO SPIGOTS, AND CHARGES FOR DESTRUCTION OF WATER LINES WILL BE ASSESSED FROM EXHIBITORS WHO DESTROY PIPES.

### **4. MANURE DISPOSAL:**

A disposal system will be in place for your horse's manure. We expect exhibitors to bring manure to these sites, and not to place it in areas where it doesn't belong. These areas are located west of stalls and tents. Thank you in advance for your help in keeping the stable area clean.

### **5. MEDICAL WASTE:**

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste. Bio Hazardous Medical Waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

### **6. MOTORIZED VEHICLES AND GOLF CARTS:**

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

### **7. ENTRY PROCEDURES:**

a. For each horse entered, send a \$50 Entry Deposit Fee along with your \$185 weekly Stall Fee, as well as the appropriate nominating fees. Weekly stalls received after the closing date of entries will be \$200 each. Send with your completely filled out entry blank on or before the closing date of entries. Entries may be returned if any of the above is incomplete.

b. Bring a check for the remainder of your fees to the show. No numbers will be issued without full payment or a signed open check may be left.

c. If entry blanks are postmarked on or before the closing date of entries and are properly filled out late fees will not be accessed.

d. **DO NOT make entries from the time schedule.** Consult the index to classes. Time schedules are subject to change after the close of entries. Therefore, upon arrival at the show, be sure to check the time schedule in the Horse Show Office. Daily time schedules will be available on line by 7:00pm the day preceding at [www.langershows.com](http://www.langershows.com).

**e. JUMPER NOMINATION FEES:**

Horses entered in any jumper class set at 1.30M or above must pay a \$100 Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$50 Entry Deposit Fee.

**f. Service Fee:**

All horses, showing or non-showing, will be assessed a fee of \$50 per show. This fee allows the horse to add and scratch from classes with no penalty (exception: adds or scratches made the day the class is being held), access to schooling areas and rings at designated times and defers all charges for regular exhibitor parking passes.

**g. EQUITATION ENTRIES:**

Equitation riders must ride the horse and wear the number of the horse they are officially entered on. If the rider wishes to change horses for an equitation class, he/she may do so without penalty; however, the proper paperwork must be completed in the horse show office prior to the class. Exhibitors who enter an equitation class on one horse and ride or wear another horse's number will be charged on both horses. Paperwork must be done in the horse show office to avoid this penalty.

**h. HORSE RECORDING REQUIREMENTS**

All horses must be registered with the USHJA. In order to be eligible for HOTY awards and/or Zone awards horses must be recorded with USEF annually or for life.

**8. MEMBERSHIP**

Present to the show secretary or mail in with entries proof of current membership (USEF and USHJA, or join at the show. If exhibitors do not have proper membership documents, and the show is unable to verify the membership information, the exhibitor will be assessed a \$30 (or \$60 if both USEF and USHJA) non-refundable non-member fee. Numbers cannot be released without proof of membership or non-member fees.

**11. POST ENTRIES:**

All entries received after closing date will pay a Late Fee of \$50. **Horses and/or riders who go in a class without entering will be charged \$25 extra.** Classes added the day the class is being held (if allowed) may be charged a \$10 post entry.

**12. SCRATCHES/CHANGES (without the official Show Vet Certificate)**

1. Scratch Division – full credit if scratched prior to the start of the first class in the division, no credit if division has begun
2. Scratch class – full credit if scratched prior to the class being held, no credit after class has begun
3. Show scratch – full credit for classes not ridden in less \$50 show scratch fee and any applicable stall fees
4. All classes (Hunter, Jumper and Equitation) scratched after the class has begun will not receive credit
5. There is no charge for exhibitors changing horses in an equitation class (see equitation entries for additional information)

**13. REFUNDS:**

Before the closing date of entries full refunds will be given. After the closing date of entries, ENTRY DEPOSIT FEES, NOMINATION FEES AND STALL FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED. After the show starts, with official show vets certificate only, full refunds will be given less a \$50 per horse "scratch fee", stall fees, and fees for classes already held prior to notification, whether exhibited in or not. If a division entry fee has to be pro-rated for a vet slip refund, the individual classes entered will be surcharged \$10 for each class in which the horse competed, in addition to the \$50 "scratch fee". **Classes scratched after the order has been drawn will not be eligible for a refund.**

**15. SUBSTITUTIONS:**

Under the same ownership, a new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse for an inclusive fee of \$50. (The scratched horse forfeits the \$50 entry deposit fee, the substituted horse pays no penalty).

**16. NON-SHOWING HORSES:**

A horse may be entered as "NON-SHOWING" on the original entry form at the time the entry blank is submitted by writing "non-showing" in the space where classes would normally be entered. An official "Non-Showing Horse" is required to pay a \$50 horse deposit fee and applicable stall fees. An official "Non-Showing Horse" who ultimately enters the horse show and competes is considered a post entry.

**17. ORDERS OF GO:**

All orders of go will be computer drawn. Horses entered after the order has been drawn may be required to go first.

**19. ADD BACK MONEY:**

In classes with add back, prize money is computed from the number of horses that actually show. Horses entered but not showing up will forfeit their add back money.

**20. PRIZES:**

All class winners will receive a trophy and ribbons through 8th place in addition to any prize money. Prize money in hunter classes will pay to 6<sup>th</sup> place; 30%, 24%, 18%, 12%, 9%, 7%. Prize money in jumper classes will pay to 5th place; 30%, 25%, 20%, 15%, 10%. Exception: Special Classes - see specifications. Prize money checks will be made to the owner listed on the entry and will be mailed within 30 days after the show. **NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE MAILED UNLESS THE SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OF THE OWNER IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY BLANK.**

**21. PRIZE MONEY – FOREIGN EXHIBITORS**

Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete form 8283 prior to prize money being issued. We encourage all foreign exhibitors to apply for a US Tax Id number.

## 22. MINOR EXHIBITORS:

Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold The Colorado Horse Park, The High Prairie Fall Horse Shows, The Colorado Hunter/Jumper Association, and Langer Equestrian Group, Inc. harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted unless a parent or guardian signs entry blank.

## 23. MANAGEMENT:

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or rising out of or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, change any course, cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; change rings or rotate judges; change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule. Once sections are combined, they will not be un-combined unless there are 8 entries in each section on the morning of the first class.

## 24. TRAILER INS:

There will be a \$35 per day grounds fee for horses trailing in and not requiring stalls. Trailers may park only in designated day trailer parking. At no time may trailers be parked in the stable area, except for loading and unloading of horses and equipment.

## 25. FEED AND BEDDING:

Hay, grain and bedding will be available at the Horse Show. The Colorado Horse Park is the feed/shavings concessionaire for the Fall Series. The feed/stabling office phone number is 303.841.3892, Products will be sold at market prices. To insure prompt delivery, please pre-order. Those exhibitors who do not pre-order must present an open check to the feed office upon arrival. Orders will be totaled at the end of each week and must be paid in full at that time. A full line of quality feeds is available for your horse. Deliveries from outside feed companies will not be allowed.

## 26. RV PARKING:

There are a limited number of RV Hookups at The Colorado Horse Park. They will be \$175 per week. Reservations must be made on the entry blanks and spaces will be available on a first-reserved basis. The stable manager will hand out RV passes. Each RV will be assigned a particular parking space. Your payment must be included with your entry and must be paid in full before you come on to the grounds with your self-contained units. Pumping service will be available, but must be scheduled with at least 24 hours notice. You may schedule your RV pumping in the Feed office.

## 28. DESIGNATED PARKING

- Trailer Parking South side of Bayou Gulch Rd., just west of the horse park entrance
- Exhibitor Parking West of the RV Lot
- VIP Parking VIP lot west of the Coles Arena
- T sticker (trainer) Parking T-Lot between the exhibitor parking lot and barn C

All trainers with ten or more horses entered will be issued passes to park in the T-Lot. These passes will be issued on a first come first served basis, once the T-Lot is full additional parking will be in the exhibitor parking lot.

Absolutely no cars or trailers may be parked in the stable area except during loading and un-loading. Cars or trailers left unattended in the stable are will be subject to towing at the owner's expense. Vehicle traffic is a safety issue that we take very seriously.

Disabled parking passes are available at no charge in the horse show office, please call ahead in order to help us facilitate your entrance to the horse show grounds 303.841.7461.

## 29. RETURNED CHECKS:

*Checks returned by the bank for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure:*

All returned checks will be charged an additional 10% penalty (minimum \$50).

Accounts will be given ten days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned into the USEF for further disciplinary action.

## 30. CLOSED RINGS:

Horses are not permitted in arenas when a course is in the process of being set for an upcoming class. **Any horses entering a ring with a posted closed sign will be subject to elimination.**

## 31. SCHOOLING SUPERVISION:

Please be advised that starters have authority, as agents of management, to scratch riders who do not follow USEF schooling rules. We are serious about the rules for the schooling areas.

## 32. COURSES:

Courses may consist of any combination of the following; Brush, Gate, Oxers, Post and Rails, Water, Liverpools, Ditch, Walls, Panels, Banks and Coops. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to adjust heights in Jumper classes as competition and or weather conditions warrant.

## 33. CONFLICTS:

It is the intention of management to avoid holding rings to wait for horses and/or riders. Riders with conflicts must arrange their jumping order with the starters so that they will not hold up a class. Starters have the authority from management to scratch riders who are not timely.

## 34. DOGS:

All dogs on the show grounds must be leashed and under control at all times. No dogs are allowed in stable area, in or around arenas or other areas, or in exterior RV areas without leashes, for their safety....and the safety of others. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. See USEF GR1301.6. Failure to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards.

## 36. ABUSE:

Competitors who abuse horses will be eliminated by the judge and may be subject to fines and/or penalties. Abuse includes, but is not limited to, excessive use of the whip and/or spurs, use of the whip in front of the horses shoulder.

## 37. POLING:

Poling and the use of Offsets ARE NOT permitted at any time, anywhere on the show grounds, during the Colorado Summer Circuit.

## 38. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES:

Please be advised that alcoholic beverages in any form may not be brought onto the show grounds.

**39. PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR:**

Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, it is compulsory for riders in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunter Seat Equitation classes, and Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI(Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Additionally, the above headgear requirements are mandatory for juniors and strongly encouraged for adults while riding at anytime anywhere on the competition grounds. Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) and /or a protective safety vest, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge. The Federation recommends that the vest meet or surpass the current ASTM standard or be certified by the SEI. See USEF GR801.4.

**41. DIRECTIONS TO THE COLORADO HORSE PARK**

From Interstate 25: Turn east on Colorado 470 - about 4 miles to Route 83, also known as Parker Road. Go South, through the town of Parker. Continue until you pass The Pinery on your left. High Prairie property begins at white fence just south of gate to The Pinery. DO NOT TURN INTO HIGH PRAIRIE. Continue through the light at High Prairie Drive and go to the next light which is Bayou Gulch Road. Turn left, pass Ponderosa High School, and you will see the show entrance on your left.

From Interstate 70, Eastbound: Take Colorado 470 (this exit occurs just as you have almost ended your descent through the foothills) until you reach Route 83 or Parker Road. Then follow directions listed above.

From Interstate 70, Westbound: Turn west on Route 86, just west of Limon. Go to Franktown intersection and turn north (left) at Route 83 or Parker Road. Travel approximately four miles and turn right on Bayou Gulch Road. The Horse Park will be on your left.
